Lurette chose Cherner stools from Zino Details for their "great curves, and for contrast against the all-white kitchen." 6. The home office has an extra-deep window seat with drawers for game storage. 7. Multicolored slate tiles on a hallway floor. 8. Succulents in terracotta pots. 9.
